Al: Why Literacy Matters Now More Than Ever



Message from the President & CEO Dr. Tracy White Weeden, Ed.D.

In May, I attended the Alaska Science of Reading Symposium in Anchorage. During the event, I listened attentively to Governor Mike Dunleavy's second annual address, aiming to align my keynote remarks with his speech.

Governor Dunleavy delivered a captivating speech, but to everyone's surprise, he revealed that the speech was created by articfical intelligence (AI). He emphasized the increasing importance of literacy in light of rapid advancements in artificial intelligence and their impact on the workforce.

This revelation heightened my sense of urgency to ensure *Literacy for All.* We regularly receive feedback from educators who are equipped by Neuhaus to prevent reading failure, whether they are delivering reading instruction the first time or providing dyslexia therapy. Teachers and leaders gain the skills to implement evidence-based practices through our delivery system and expert coaching. However, what truly ignites my passion for change is the opportunity to provide reading instruction to our adult literacy students, who have been failed by the system but find success at Neuhaus Education Center under the care of Certified Academic Language Therapists.

Alarmingly, one in three adults in Houston struggle with functional illiteracy. Systems must be transformed. We have the potential to make a profound generational impact in our country. Ideally, our focus should be on preventing literacy failure in schools, rendering our adult literacy program unnecessary.

The rise of AI poses a fundamental question: If we fail to instill literacy in today's children, how will they navigate the demands of digital, financial, and health literacy? The ability to read, write, and effectively utilize AI as a tool will be crucial for opportunities in an information age.

New Dyslexia Law House Bill 3928

On June 10, 2023, House Bill 3928 by Representative Steve Toth and Senator Tan Parker was signed into law by Governor Greg Abbott.

This law relates to dyslexia evaluations and services for Texas public school students, the provision of se<u>rvices for</u> students with dyslexia and related disorders, and certain parental notice regarding the rights of parents of public school students with disabilities.

To implement this new law, the Texas Education Agency (TEA) will be creating policies and procedures.
