Adult Literacy Program to Promote Literacy and Community Conversations

The program aims to promote literacy, diversity, and community conversations by encouraging individuals to read and discuss books with a common theme. It offers three book selections for different age groups, including children, teens, and adults.

Adult literacy students will use Bookshare to access audiobook versions of the book, and the class will be taught by experienced instructor and Certified Academic Language Therapist (CALT), Linda McKnight.

Lara Speights, Vice President of Family Support and Adult Literacy, said, "This program provides a great opportunity for adult learners to enhance their literacy skills, engage in meaningful discussions with their peers, and connect with their community.
