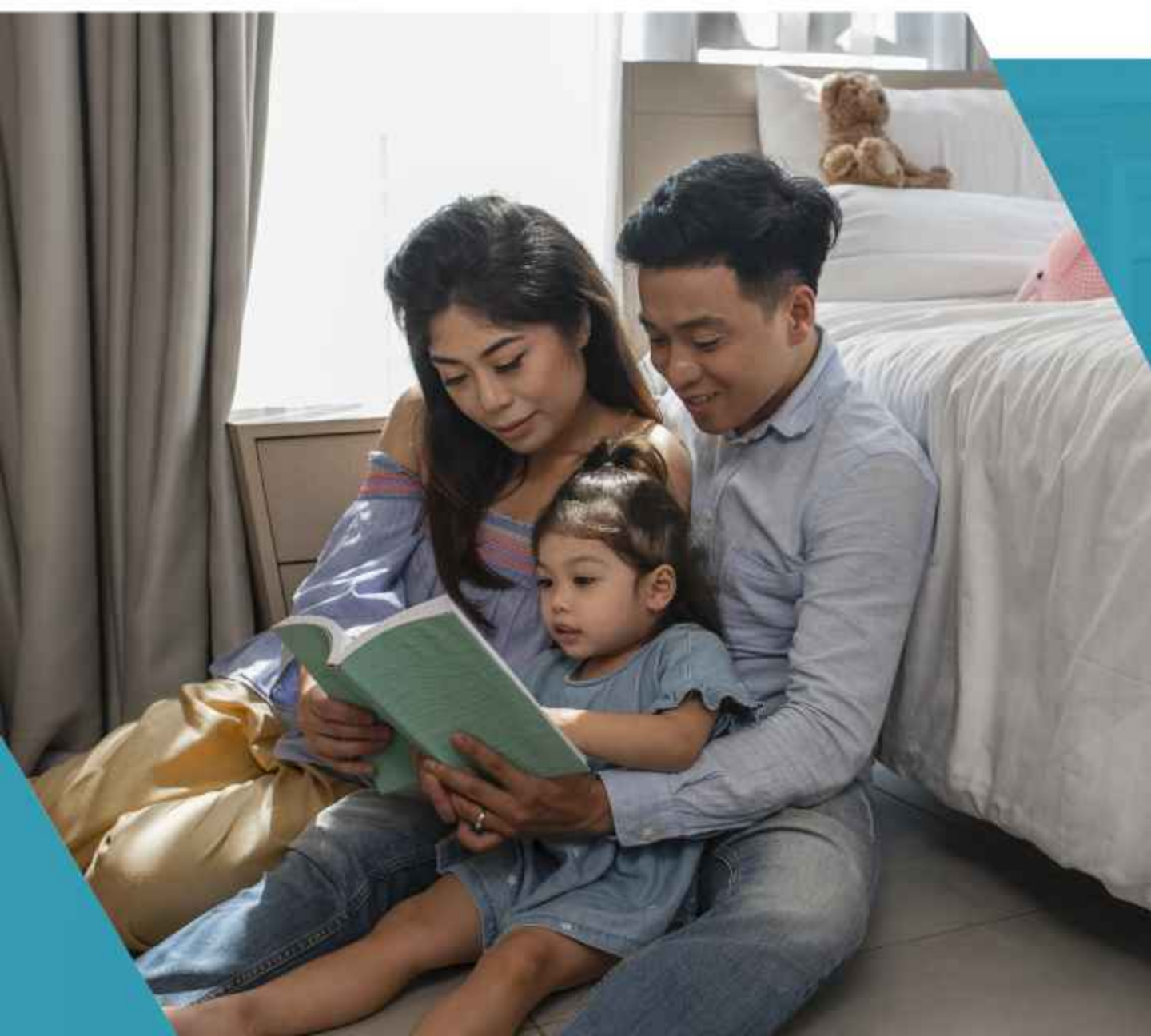
College Panel
